1. *Crime and Patrol Summary*

See attachments. The department responded to 845 requests for service during the month of February. Community Service responded to 77 requests for service.

This month saw an increase in retail theft. One of Craig's major retail businesses has placed a loss prevention agent in their store. This agent has observed several individuals attempting to steal numerous items. The agent contacts the individuals and calls for police service. Most of the individuals are cited and released by the officer.

Violation of protection orders or bond conditions has kept the officers busy this month. Most of the violations were the result of calls for service. The most common violation of a bond or protection order is having contact with a protected party.

Juvenile Sexting Crime-H.B. 1302 that went in to effect on January 1st. (18-6-403 (3.5) (7) 18-7-109) Ryan, Norm and I met with the Craig Daily Press in regards to the new juvenile sexting crimes. According to the Colorado School Resource Center, they are still working out several issues with this new statute. . . to say the least. (Like it might be legal for a 10 year old to send explicit pictures of themselves to a 14 year old..or 14 year old to 10 year old. . . if they both consent. . . say what ??) Even though the new statute allows for a summons to be issued, for now we will continue to send all juvenile sexting type cases to the District Attorney to review for charges. We will put out updates from the state as they become available. The Colorado School Resource Center did send Ryan a good-short-power point training out of Weld County if you are interested. Please let us know if you have questions.

- MCHS students (7-9 per session) were presented classes on Drug and Alcohol Awareness, Healthy Relationships and Depression/Suicide.*
- "5 Minutes with the SRO" interview.*

- *Parent Night at CMS for Building a Healthy You, presentation on HB 1302 (Sexting Law)*
- *Attended two staffing meetings for CYDC (Formerly SB94) students, these meetings are done in order to find what the least restrictive placement would be for juveniles currently in Detention.*

- *Sandrock Elementary School, spoke to a student who called 911 during a domestic violence incident at her home, reassured her that she did the right thing to protect her mother.*
- *Ridgeview Elementary, threats reported to me by a parent who didn't feel the school handled appropriately. It was handled properly and the parents were educated.*
- *Sandrock Elementary, report of child abuse that turned out to be a parental discipline matter, no crime.*
- *Sandrock Elementary, took a traffic complaint about a parent using the wrong entrance in violation of the one-way signs. I was unable to find them doing this myself and the complainant did not want to sign a statement.*
- *Sunset Elementary, assisted staff in restraining a physically violent student.*

- *Sunset Elementary, assisted with a student acting out in self harm.*
- *Sandrock Elementary, parent signed a traffic complaint against another parent for failing to use a car seat for a 6 year-old. Citation issued.*
