SUBJECT: Activity Report – January 2018

1. Crime and Patrol Summary

See attachments. The department responded to 884 requests for service during the month of January. Community Service responded to 113 requests for service.

During the last several weeks, our community experienced several daytime burglaries of homes and numerous thefts from vehicles. On Tuesday, January 16, 2018; a concerned citizen called in a suspicious person in a residential neighborhood. With the information provided by the citizen and evidence at the scene of the burglaries, officers of the Craig Police Department were granted a search warrant for a residence in Craig. The search was executed and several stolen items from local burglaries and thefts were recovered. Also stolen items were recovered from a pawn shop in Rifle, CO. Two Craig residents were arrested on several different charges.
