SUBJECT: Activity Report – October 2018

1. Crime and Patrol Summary

See attachments. The department responded to 1,105 requests for service during the month of October. Community Service responded to 133 requests for service.

We are continuing to have patrols in the school zones during the day. This month, we again had several arrests for violations of protection orders or violations of bond conditions. Most of these arrests occur when we contact the individual and they have been consuming alcohol or drugs.

We also arrested several people for warrants. Most of these arrests were for individuals who did not show up for court or did not comply with the orders of the court. While arresting some of the individuals, they were found to have illegal items on their person and received additional charges.

3. Miscellaneous

October 27th, Moffat County Sheriff's Office, The Memorial Regional Health-Open Heart Advocates and the Craig Police Department hosted a prescription drug take back day. Fifty-three pounds of prescription drugs were collected.



*October 29th through November 2nd, the Craig Police Department, SAPP (Substance Abuse Prevention Program) and Grand Futures participated in **Red Ribbon Week**, which is a national campaign to raise awareness of the risks and consequences of drug use. The theme was "Life is Your Journey, Travel Drug-Free". Craig Middle School was the target audience to reiterate what students are learning in D.A.R.E. School Resources Officers Nathan Businger and Ryan Fritz addressed current drug use trends Craig schools, focusing on vaping which seems to be a popular trend, specifically in our schools.*

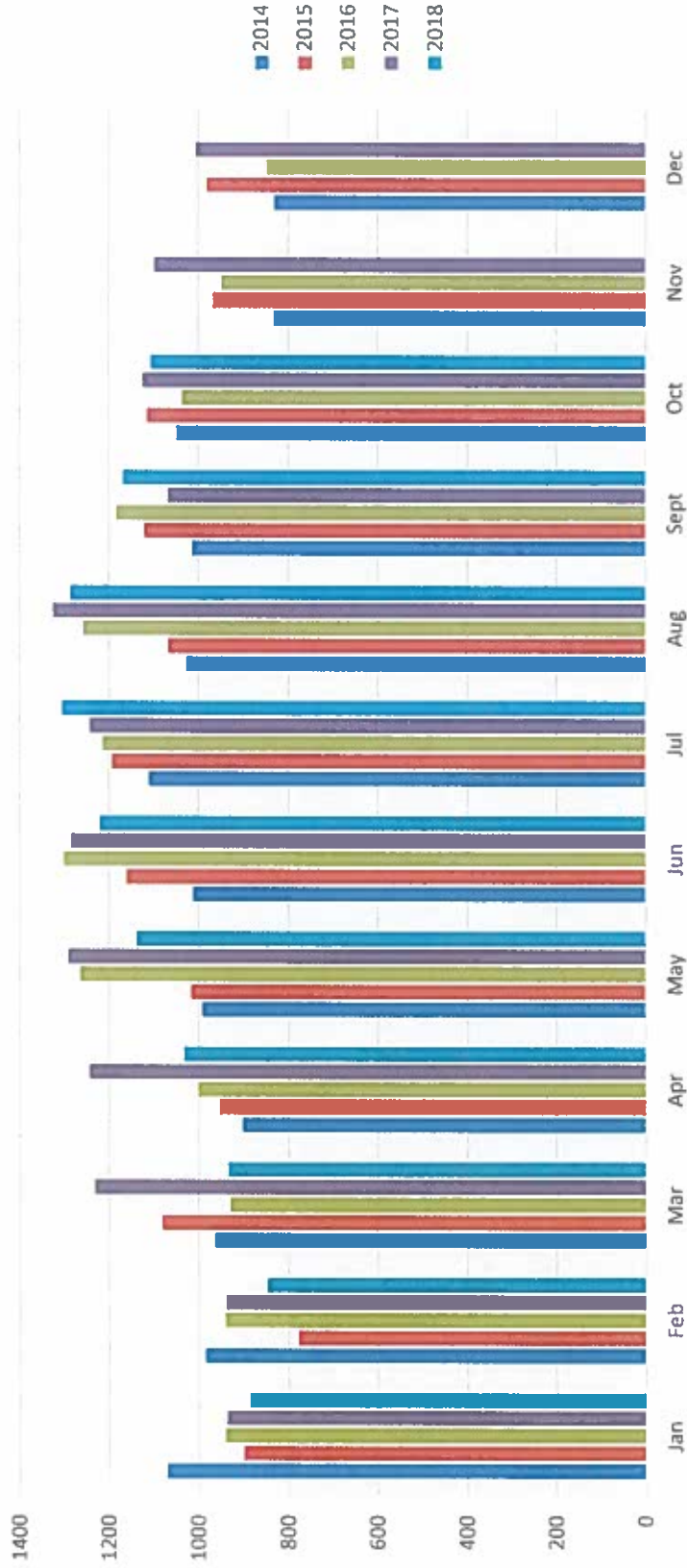
