1. *Crime and Patrol Summary*

See attachments. The department responded to 937 requests for service during the month of February. Community Service responded to 98 requests for service.

Cooperation between the Craig Police Department and the Moffat County Sheriff's Office is evident on a weekly if not a daily basis. This month a deputy noticed a suspicious male jogging on Industrial Avenue at approximately 1:30 am. An officer tried to make contact with the male. The male sprinted away from the officer toward Cedar Mountain Trailer Park. The male left tracks in the snow and the deputy was able to follow the tracks to a residence inside the trailer park. Officers and the deputy knocked on the door of the residence and one of the males that is living at the trailer answered the door. After a short conversation with the male and the male stating there was no one else in the trailer, the officers were allowed to enter the home. Inside of the residence four people were visible in the front room not including the resident. Officers knocked on another door to another room in the trailer and found a female in one of the rooms. The female was sitting on the bed and behind her was a large "lump" of covers. Underneath the covers was a male that had a warrant for his arrest for escape. The male was arrested for the warrant. Another bedroom was checked and inside this room was a male and female. These individuals were checked through the computer. Both of them had warrants for their arrest for failure to comply. There were a total of 9 people in the trailer and three people were arrested for warrants.

Officer Rimmer and Officer continue to teach the DARE curriculum to the Ridgeview and East Elementary 5th grades as well as teaching DARE at Calvary Baptist for the 5th and 6th graders there.

Officer Fritz remains working patrol shifts in order to cover our personnel shortfall, he has been working within the school as call loads allow in order to stay involved with the schools and school activities. Hopefully during March, he will return to full-time status as an SRO.
