SUBJECT: Activity Report – April 2019

1. Crime and Patrol Summary

See attachments. The department responded to 986 requests for service during the month of April. Community Service responded to 127 requests for service.

We investigated two serious traffic crashes this month. The first crash involved a vehicle and two motorcycles. The vehicle proceeded from a stop sign in front of the motorcycles. The driver of the vehicle was not injured, but the two motorcycle operators were injured and taken to the hospital. Our newest hire, Mike Cochran, was the investigating officer. With his twenty years of prior experience, he handled this investigation well.

The second crash involved a vehicle hitting a pedestrian which caused serious injury to the pedestrian. The driver of the vehicle left the scene of the crash. With interviews of witness and the victim we were able to identify the driver of the vehicle. An arrest warrant was issued for the driver.

All the drugs collected were turned over to DEA for disposal.
