1. Crime Summary

See attachments. The department responded to 940 requests for service during the month of February. Community Service responded to 128 requests for service.

2. Community Service

CSOs Josh Wright and Jill Nelson handled the following calls during the month of February.

- *Red tagged twenty-nine abandoned vehicles. Two vehicles were towed.*
- *No weed complaints*
- *Two code violations*
- *Two junk/trash violations*
- *No Administrative Warnings were issued*
- *Ten parking violation warnings were issued*
- *Five parking citations were issued*
- *No code citations were issued*
- *No Abatements conducted; Cost of Abatements – \$0.00*

3. *Miscellaneous*

An internal Strategic Planning Committee completed the process for setting our strategic objectives for 2016. See attached 2016 Strategic Plan.

*On February 24th, 2016 a concerned parent noticed changes in the behavior of her 14 year old daughter. The parent checked her daughter's social media accounts and found that a 37 year old male, who was known to the parent, was sending sexually inappropriate messages to her 14 year old daughter on Facebook. The parent reported the incident to the Craig Police Department. On 02-25-2016, the Craig Police Department, assisted by ACET, the Moffat County District Attorney's Office, The Moffat County Sheriff's Office, and Advocates Crisis Support Services; conducted an internet sting operation relating to the above reported case. An investigator with the Craig Police Department assumed the role of a 14 year old female and contacted the above 37 year old male on Facebook. The Facebook conversation quickly turned sexual in nature. The 37 year old male agreed to meet at a designated location, believing he was meeting an underage girl for a sexual act. When the male arrived at the designated location, he was met by investigators instead. Craig resident, **Jason Allen McCamant**; was arrested and booked in to the Moffat County Jail on the following charges:*

- *Internet Luring of a Child-Class 4 Felony*
- *Enticement of a Child-Class 4 Felony*
- *Internet Sexual Exploitation of a Child-Class 4 Felony*

4. *SRO Activity*

Officer Rimmer and Officer Fritz are continuing to teaching DARE at Sandrock and Ridgeview Elementary Schools; on track to complete the DARE Program with spring classes by second week of April.

Officer Rimmer and Officer Fritz have been involved in the following activities for February.

- *Attended, mediated and participated in multiple youth in conflict and truancy issues at CMS, MPHS and the elementary schools.*
- *Screened multiple reports of abuse, most forwarded to patrol.*
- *MCHS, investigated report of Marijuana Distribution, forwarded to DA's Office.*
- *MCHS, fire drill*
- *MCHS, had a follow up conversation with a student about requesting inappropriate pictures from an underage girl (family did not want prosecution)*

- *Handled multiple bullying issues at MCHS and CMS*
- *Sunset Elementary – two different fights investigated.*
- *Grand Futures Board meeting.*
- *Participated in monthly SAPP meeting.*
- *Investigated internet luring case of a MCHS Student.*
- *MCHS, spoke to a parent about a bullying issue, spoke to multiple students and parents.*
- *Sunset Elementary, meeting with student and parent about truancy issues.*
- *MCHS, issued citation to student who was driving recklessly in the parking lot (written warning previously issued)*
- *Completed Law Related Education with 8th Grade Government Classes for three days.*
- *Conducted Lockdown Drills at two elementary schools.*
- *Sunset Elementary, harassment report, unwanted physical contact.*
- *CMS, investigated an Instagram Comment as harassment, did not fit statute.*
- *Safe 2 Tell, possibly suicidal student. This was passed on to Aurora Public Schools, where the student had moved to.*
- *Sandrock Elementary, welfare check on high risk student (and family).*
- *Sandrock Elementary gave ALICE refresher to staff.*
- *Sunset Elementary, gave ALICE training to all graded pre-K through 5th.*
- *East Elementary spoke with Principal about a high risk family.*
- *Sunset Elementary, assisted with student that ran off campus.*
- *CMS – 3 fight investigations.*
- *Served several truancy court order papers for parents and students.*
- *Participated in two truancy court hearings.*
- *Sunset Elementary, same student ran off campus again, this time he ran up a tree and it took the effort of multiple people to get him down, he was evaluated for an M1.*
- *CMS, Safe 2 Tell for a student cutting, spoke to student with counselor.*
- *Sunset Elementary, same student from earlier ran away from home, was found with the assistance of Sunset staff and family members.*
- *Assisted Patrol/Deputies with an off campus fight involving 28 MCHS students.*
- *MCHS, welfare check on possibly suicidal student.*
- *MCHS, basketball games, removed one adult that had been previously trespassed.*
- *MCHS, Sadie Hawkins dance.*
- *Sunset Elementary, assisted in search for missing juvenile (the same one from the tree)*
- *CMS – Investigated student under the influence of Marijuana.*

- *CMS – numerous mental health calls for student self-harm. Worked with mind springs with a few M-1 holds.*
- *Participated in locating a Runaway Student from Sunset that left his house around 3 am. Student was found around 7:30 am.*
- *Investigated two different reported possible sex assaults involving students.*
- *MCHS, report of Facebook harassment, no charges.*
- *Sunset Elementary, worked with a youth in conflict.*
- *Ridgeview, two days of training ALICE to students - pre-K through 5th grade.*
- *East Elementary, welfare check on preschool child.*
- *MCHS, tobacco violation.*
- *GOAL Academy, answered questions from a staff member on things she witnessed during a home visit.*
- *MCHS, worked with a youth in conflict after his suspension.*
- *Sunset Elementary, cold report of a kindergarten student making a comment about bringing a gun to school. This possibly happened when he was a Steamboat schools student.*
- *Sunset Elementary, observed the 4th grade watch the child abuse video.*
- *MCHS, threat investigation.*
- *MCHS, M1 evaluation.*
- *Assisted Patrol with the sighting of then trying to locate a MCHS runaway.*

Organizational Excellence

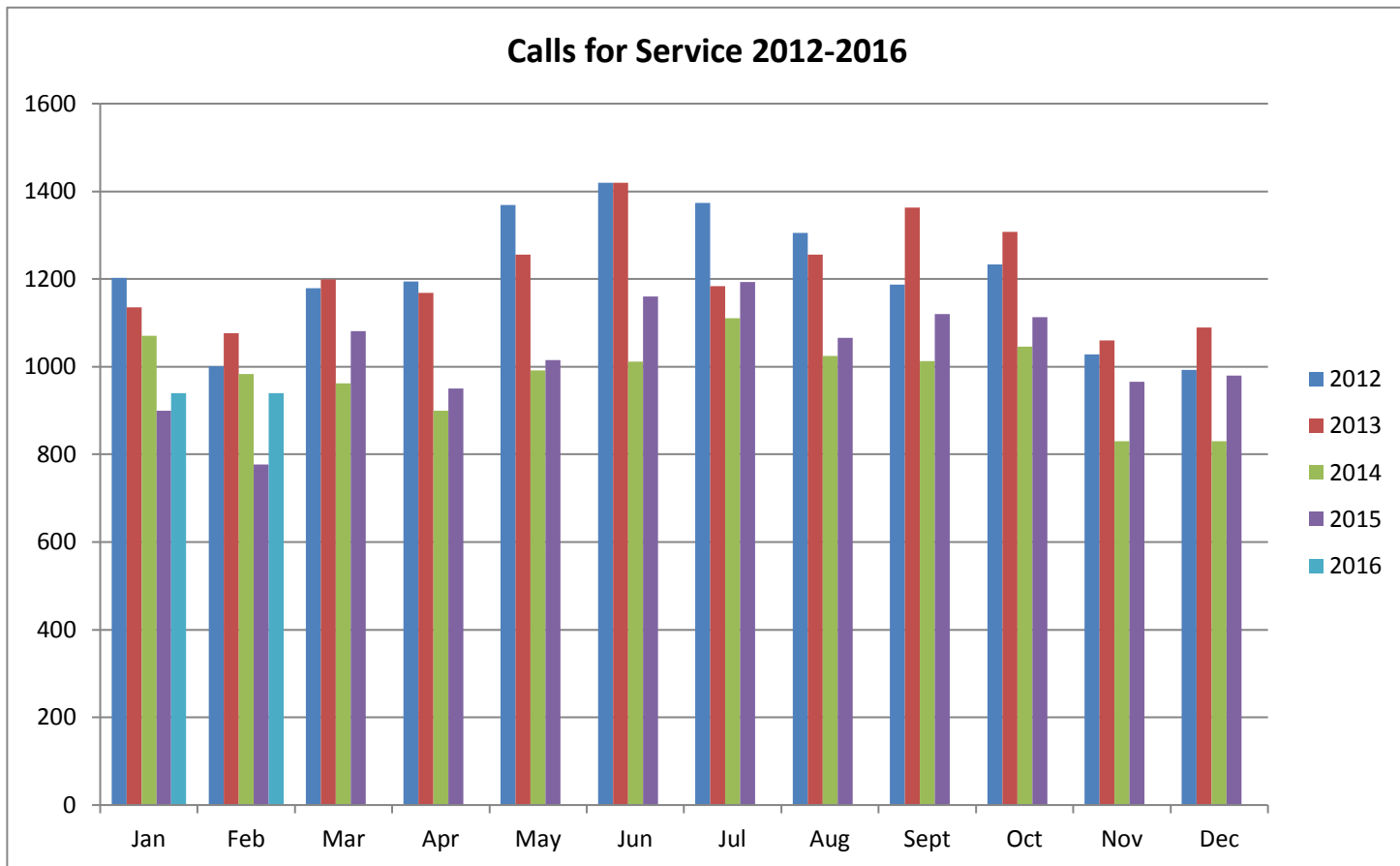
- ◆ Consider Grant writer to look for additional funding opportunities
