1. *Crime and Patrol Summary*

See attachments. The department responded to 1,035 requests for service during the month of October. Community Service responded to 140 requests for service.

The patrol division had another busy month handling calls for service. School zones are being patrolled during the drop off and pick up times to provide a safe environment for the children.

Interesting call for the month: Patrol Officers stopped a vehicle that possibly had a stolen bike inside. When the vehicle was stopped there were four individuals inside the vehicle. The vehicle was driven by a female. The driver of the vehicle was driving with a revoked license and possession of a control substance schedule II and IV. One of the male passengers was arrested on charges of possession of schedule II controlled substance, possession drug paraphernalia, criminal possession of a financial device and a Mesa County Warrant. Another male was arrested for possession of schedule IV controlled substance. A warrant will be completed for the fourth individual for tampering with evidence, unlawful possession of Schedule IV possession of a controlled substance, theft and possession drug paraphernalia. It should be noted the stolen bike was not in the vehicle, but it was later recovered at a residence.

During the month of October, we finished up the background investigation for our open patrol officer position. On October 31st, we offered the job to the best applicant and he will start on November 21st.

October 22nd, Craig Police Department along with Colorado State Patrol conducted a drug take-back event in the parking lot west of the McDonald's on Victory Way. 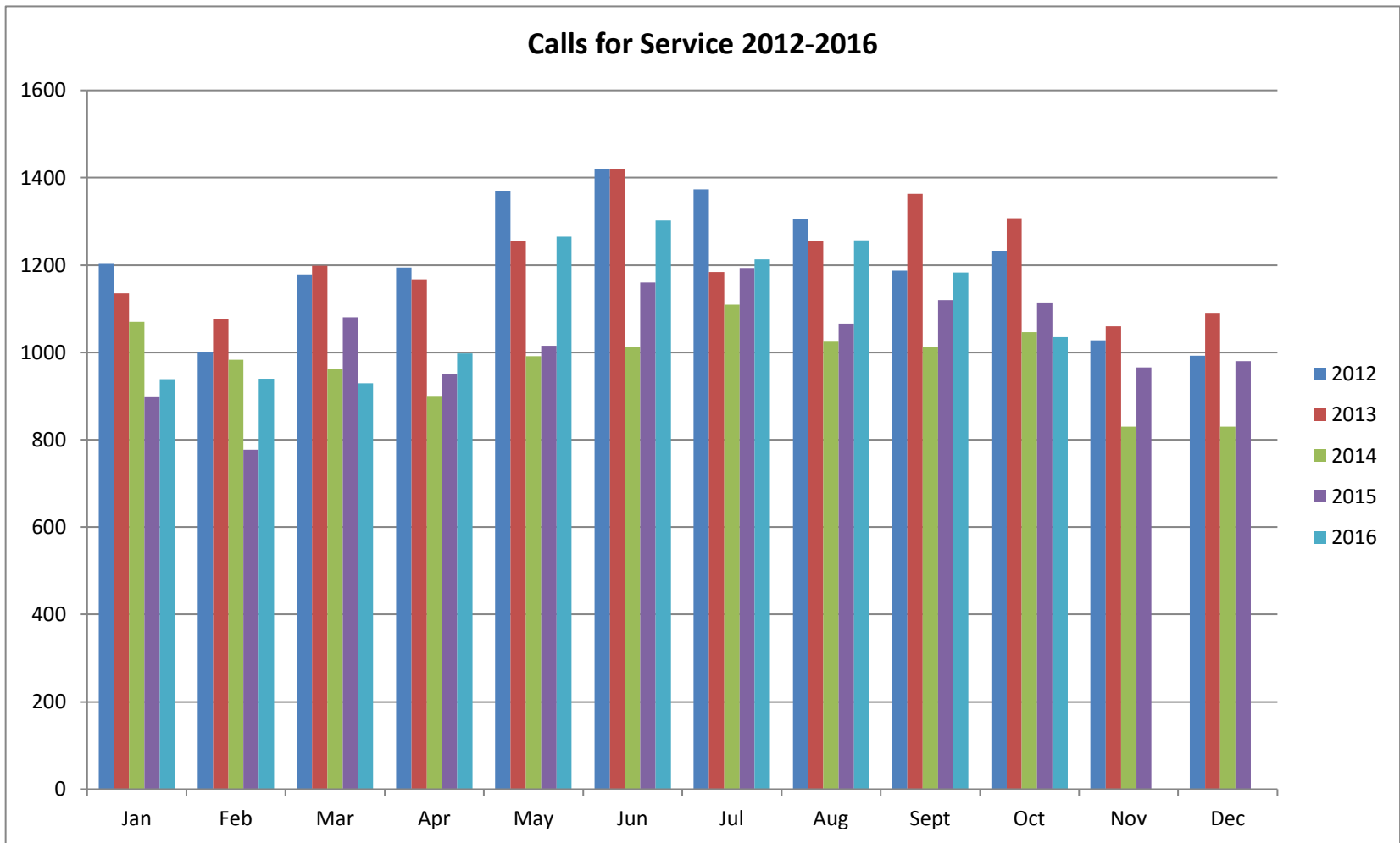
