Crime and Patrol Summary

See attachments. The department responded to 1,123 requests for service during the month of October. Community Service responded to 173 requests for service.

This month, we handled a call that resulted in the death of a male. The specifics of the death were published in the paper and we are limited on what can be released. What I can tell you is when we have a crime of this magnitude, it is very time consuming for the responding officers and also the investigators.

The trend continues with possession of illegal drugs. This month, several more individuals were charged with possession of Schedule I or II drugs. Most of these charges start with a contact of an individual; and during the contact, the illegal drugs are located.

In last month's report, I reported on the stolen vehicles a person was arrested for, along with other charges. This month, the same person was at a party. He obtained the keys (unlawfully) for a vehicle and took off in the vehicle without the owner's permission. The vehicle was later located with the suspect still in the vehicle. The suspect was charged accordingly.


