## 1. *Crime and Patrol Summary*

*See attachments. The department responded to 1,098 requests for service during the month of November. Community Service responded to 146 requests for service.*

*This month, we continued to have the drug related arrests as in previous months.*

*We saw an increase of reported thefts. The thefts range from less than \$50 to over \$20,000. Several of the thefts were from vehicles and front yards.*

*The large theft was from a local business. The Loss Control Division of the business was able to set up surveillance to catch the employee in the act of taking the funds. A warrant was issued for the suspect.*

*Another theft was over \$7,000. A person cashed a stolen check from a Steamboat Springs company at a local business. Together with the information provided by the victims and working with the Steamboat Springs Police Department, a warrant will be issued shortly for the suspect.*

- Summons issued for MIP-Alcohol, total of six girls involved. Later investigated an Intimidation of a Witness for bullying behaviors against the girl that reported the issue.

- Email was flagged for inappropriate photo, investigation of possible child pornography distributed by a student

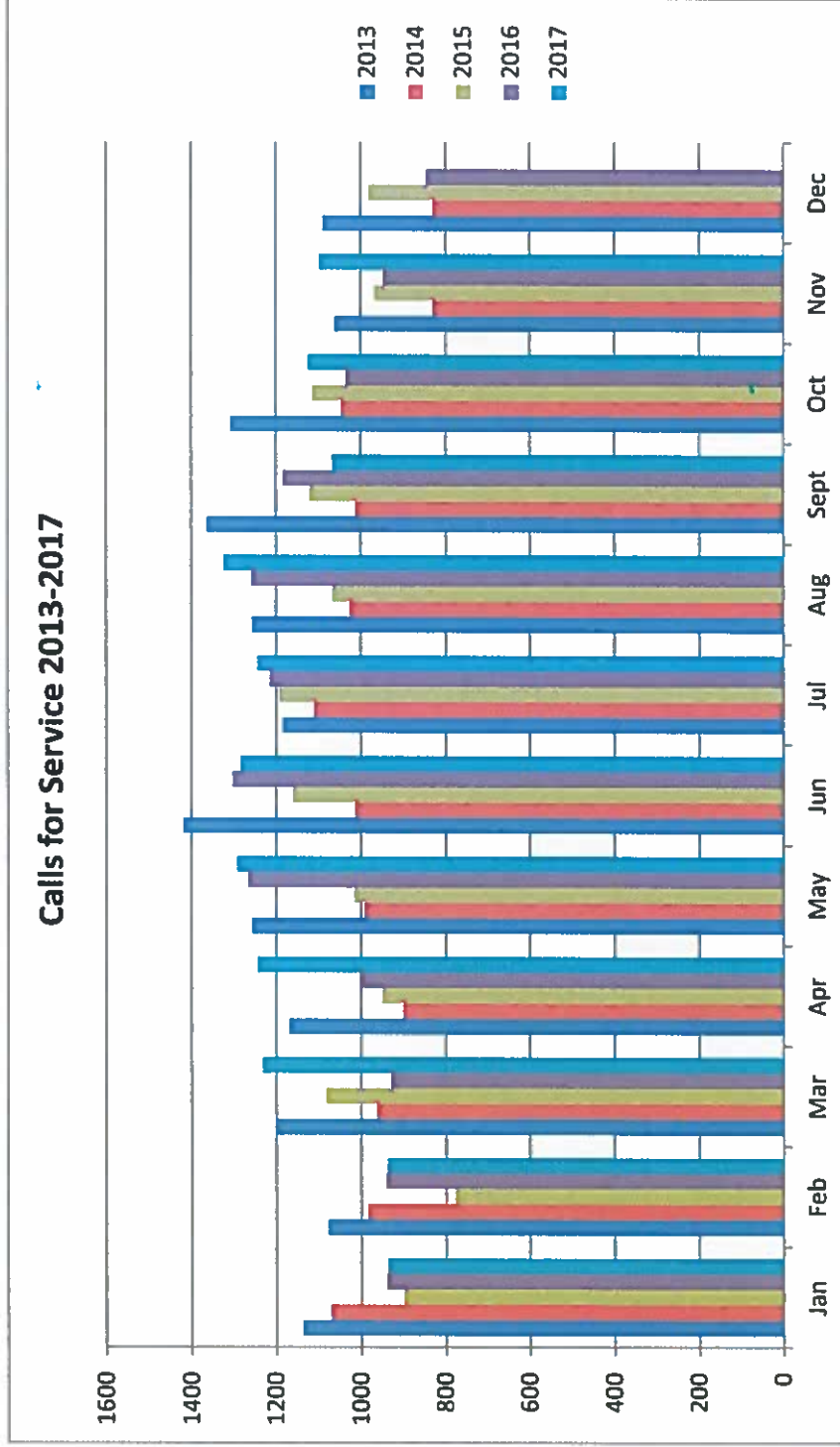
